## Rylee's Pullover Caddisby Lucas Langton

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## **Materials Needed:**

Hook: TMC 100 standard dry fly hook

Thread: 6/0 Tan (or black)

Wing: Elk Hair

Body: Clear V-Rib, 2mm foam hook gap width

Hackle: color to match

Thorax: Superfine dubbing color to match



Start thread.


Attach foam just short of hook eye.

Wrap thread over foam to bend.



Make your foam post. The post should be equal in length to the foam on the hook shank.

Tie in your hackle using the foam tail at the back of the fly.



Wrap your hackle to the base of the post and tie it off.

Tie in the v-rib, start it even with the foam body on the shank to ensure a smooth body.



Wrap your V-rib to the end of your body tie it off and add a small amount of dubbing for your thorax.



Pull your hackle post over the body and tie it in just past your dubbing.



Clean, stack, and tie in a small clump of elk hair same as you would for a traditional elk hair caddis. Leave the foam untrimmed to ensure a clean hook eye.

Whip finish and glue.

Trim the foam equal to the hair butts on the front of the fly. Trim any stray hackles that may have been pushed to the bottom side of the fly.
