

Fly Dun

Materials Needed:

Hook: TMC 100 #12-20

Thread: Black 6.0 – 8/0

Tail: Grizzly Spade Hackle Fibers

Body: Floss Black

Rib: Floss White

Wing: Grizzly Saddle Hackle Tips

Hackle: Grizzly



1. Attach the hook to the vise and attach your thread just behind the eye. Wrap back to the bend of the hook.

2. Clip 6-12 stiff hackle fibers from a tailing or spade hackle and keep the ends even. The length of the tails should be the same as the wing, from the eye to the bend of the hook. Position the tailing fibers at a 45 degree position in front of the shank and apply two soft thread loops, tightening them to bring the fibers to the top of the shank. Trim and secure the butt ends.



3. Attach two strands of black floss to the bottom of the shank as well as a half strand of white. Wrap and secure the floss to the tail tie-down position.



4. Wrap the black floss forward for a thin tapered body just past the midpoint of the shank.



5. Twist the half strand of white floss and wrap it forward with spiral wraps about 4-5 times. Secure with thread wraps.



6. Attach two hackle tips, facing each other, just in front of the body. The wings should be equal to the tail length, from the eye to the bend of the hook.



7. Attach a Grizzly hackle by the butt at the base of the wing with the shiny side facing you.

8. Wrap the hackle forward about 4-5 turns leaving room for the head. Secure the hackle, trim the butts, and wrap a small head.

Whip Finish.
